Welcome and Introductions

Mr. Raines and Mr. Kassube welcome everyone to the meeting.

Old Business (Mr. Rick Raines)

Mr. Kassube discussed his inquiry into why the ABC Dry Cleaners site did not have an active RAB. Mr. Kassube told the group that he had spoken with Luis Florez and found that since a ROD had been signed for the site there was no requirement for a RAB.

New Business (Mr. Rick Raines)

Mr. Raines briefly discussed the new RAB guidance that is out for comment and provided copies to the RAB members. Mr. Raines noted the due date for comments and suggested that if anyone wanted to comment they should write a letter asking for an extension.

Ms. Tiki Whitfield (EPA Community Involvement Coordinator) gave a presentation on Technical Assistance Grants (TAG's). The presentation covered who is eligible for a TAG, what a TAG can pay for, how to go about applying for a TAB etc. She also highlighted some of the differences between the TAPP (DoD) and the TAG program. Ms. Corey Fischer from the Hazardous Substance Research Center (HSRC) briefly discussed the HSRC's Technical Outreach Services for Communities (TOSC) and Technical Assistance to Brown fields (TAB) programs. More information on the HSRC TOSC and TAB programs will be added to the MCBCL RAB website.

Updates

Mr. Ron Kenyon and Mr. Matt Louth gave an update on IR Site 89 and the Electric Resistive Heating (ERH) Pilot Project that is currently on going. Highlights of the update were as follows:

- The ERH system was started up for real on October 26, 2003.
- Approximately 40,000 lbs extracted to date.
- Approximately 35 dollars per pound removed (This is excellent).
- The system will continue to run for longer than planned due to its effectiveness.

Mr. Louth gave and update on Site 35 and the progress of the modified Fenton's injection. The plume at Site 35 is currently moving under the new bypass being constructed across Camp Geiger. The decision was made to "attack" the plume while it was directly under the median. The IR team is working closely with the DoT on this issue so that our work at the site does not impact their schedule.

Mr. Hood provided brief updates on the horizontal well installation and hydrogen sparging at IR Site 73 as well as the PCB contaminated soil removal action at IR Site 84. Mr. Hood stated that 400' horizontal well that will be used at Site 73 has been installed and hydrogen sparging would begin in the near future. The soil removal at IR Site 84 is underway.

Mr. Raines discussed documents (OU6 ROD, FY04 SMP, 5 year review) that are out for review now and in the near future.

Conclusion

The next RAB meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 1st, 2004. Logistics for meeting time and location will be coordinated prior to that time. RAB members will receive a letter, an e-mail, and a phone call reminder.
