For years she stood watch so that our fellow countrymen could sleep soundly, in safety,


knowing that this Marine would stand the watch.

Melton was born in Stamps,
Arkansas on June 25, 1978.
She enlisted in the Marine
Corps on 19 February 1997
and attended recruit training
at Marine Corps Recruit
Depot, Parris Island South
Carolina. Upon graduation,
Private Melton reported to
Marine Combat Training.

Upon completion of Marine Combat Training Camp Geiger, North Carolina, she then attended the Basic Supply Warehouse School in Camp Johnson, North Carolina. Upon graduation, Private Melton was promoted to Private First Class. She reported to her first duty station during August 1997 and was assigned to 7th Motors Transport Battalion, Camp Pendleton, California where she served as the Issue and Receiving Clerk. Private First Class Melton was promoted to Lance Corporal on 1 May 1998 and meritoriously promoted to Corporal on 2 November 1999 where she served as the Mechanized Allowance Listing Noncommissioned Officer. In February 2001, Corporal Melton reported to 3<sup>rd</sup> Material Readiness Battalion, Okinawa, Japan where she served as the Noncommissioned Officer in Charge of the Deployed Support Unit and the Barracks Wing Noncommissioned Officer. In February 2002, Corporal Melton reported to Marine Corps Logistics Base Albany, Georgia and served as the Platoon Sergeant for the Fleet Support Division and Sassy Retrograde Unit. She was promoted to Sergeant on 1 April 2002 and served in numerous billets to include Chief Instructor for Corporal's Course.

During her tenure, Staff Sergeant Melton served as Staff Noncommissioned Officer in Charge of Female Clothing and Recruit Initial Issue. In July 2011, she reported to Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, California and was assigned to Combat Logistics Regiment 15, 1st Supply Battalion where she served as the Storage G-Lot Staff Noncommissioned Officer in Charge.

In January 2012, Staff Sergeant Melton reported to Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, San Diego, California Marine Wing Communications Squadron 38 and served as the Supply Chief, Warehouse Chief, and Squadron Uniformed Victim Advocate. In August 2013, Staff Sergeant Melton was promoted to Gunnery Sergeant. In January 2014, she was reassigned to Combat Logistics Regiment, 1st Supply Battalion and served as Staff Noncommissioned Officer in Charge of Initial Issue Provisioning.

From July 2014 to February 2018, Gunnery Sergeant Melton was assigned to The Basic School, Quantico, Virginia. During her tenure, she served as Regimental Corporals Course Assistant Director, Battalion Operations Chief, Headquarters Company First Sergeant and Company Gunnery Sergeant. From August 2019 to June 2021, Master Sergeant Melton was assigned to Marine Corps Installations Pacific, Marine Corps Base Camp Butler, Okinawa, Japan and 3d Marine Logistics Group, 3<sup>rd</sup> Supply Battalion. During her tenure she served as Base Warehouse Chief, Staff Noncommissioned Officer in Charge of the Storage Bins and Operations Section.

In July 2021, Master Sergeant Melton reported to 2d Marine Logistics Group, 2d Combat Readiness Regiment, Supply Company, Supply Management Unit and served as Storage Bulk Staff Noncommissioned Officer in Charge.

On 7 January 2022, Master Sergeant Melton was promoted to Master Gunnery Sergeant and served as Storage Operations Staff Noncommissioned Officer in Charge until March 2024.

Master Gunnery Sergeant Melton is currently assigned to 2<sup>nd</sup> Combat Readiness Regiment Supply Company serving as the Staff Noncommissioned Officer in Charge of the Storage Platoon.

Master Gunnery Sergeant Lora has served successfully in key billets to include: Noncommissioned Officer-In-Charge of the Corporals' Course and Chief Instructor, Supply Chief, Staff Noncommissioned Officer-In-Charge, Company First Sergeant, and Battalion Operations Chief. In August 2019, Master Gunnery Sergeant Lora reported to Marine Corps Installations Pacific, Marine Corps Base, Camp Butler, Okinawa, Japan where she served as the Base Warehouse Chief. On 1 November 2022, Master Gunnery Sergeant Lora was promoted to her current rank. Master Gunnery Sergeant Lora currently serves in 2d Supply Battalion, 2d Marine Logistics Group, Supply Management Unit as the Storage Operations Staff Noncommissioned Officer-In-Charge.
